Clubhouse Operations

- Our Clubhouse hosted over 250 member events in 2024, and the team is excited about the events that are scheduled for the remainder of Winter 2025
- As we look forward to 2025, we will continue to evaluate programming and operational efficiencies to make sure we are providing high quality events while being fiscally responsible.

Golf & Grounds

- Scott is excited about working with the Salisbury staff, across all departments, especially collaborating with the golf team to help them define their roles for success. - Meetings with many committees have begun and we look forward to his input as we
 develop and finalize the golf schedule for 2025. It will be a great year to watch the
 golf operation evolve.
- The Huguenot Nine and Practice Greens Project is 80% complete. Pending any weather delays, we plan to re-open these areas in May 2025. Please remember that the greens need time for the roots to develop so that they will look great!

Financial

- Despite dealing with significant cost increases over the last few years, we continue to meet our budgets.
- The Club continues to remain in a solid financial position, and we look forward to paying off our existing debt in April of this year.
- As noted in the December 2024 meeting, the Club's Net Worth has doubled to over \$14 million since 2018 due to consistent investment and balance sheet management.
- As we look toward 2025, we will continue to search for ways to share more financial updates, as well as increase transparency for our capital outlays.

Strategic Planning

- Building on the 2023 finalized Strategic Plan and accompanying Facilities Master Plan, last year the Strategic Planning Committee worked on identifying future projects to enhance our campus.
- This year's committee will be hard at work collaborating with Commonwealth
 Architects to identify the costs of these projects and will work with the Finance
 Committee to identify the funding levers for the membership to consider.

Athletics

- The four new Pickleball Courts were highly utilized in 2024 and fostered an environment where we had several new players to the sport involved in leagues and/or recreational play.
- The ISF has been busting at the seams the first few weeks of 2025 with many members utilizing the gym.
- USTA Mixed Leagues are underway, and I want to wish all the teams the best of luck this winter.
- There are several events scheduled for the end of the month including our Ladies' Tennis Member/Member Tournament, Pickleball Socials, and Cornhole/Pong Tournament.

Membership

- Overall, member retention rates over the last several years are above average when compared to historical norms.
- Our waitlist continues to be strong with over 64 families currently on the list.
- We will continue conducting interviews and make data-driven decisions on when to
 offer membership to new families, taking into consideration we must maintain our
 current member experience.
- Our initiation fees will continue to be monitored relative to the market; remaining conscious that we want to maintain a healthy waitlist and minimize market corrections.

Your 2025 Board is looking forward to building on the great work from last year. We have a great Club, with awesome members, and staff that care about your experience. Let's continue to protect our assets, recognize our staff, and look for ways to continue to enhance the Salisbury experience.
